The CHORD Project

The CHORD projects have been designed to assist the regeneration and economic development of five waterfront towns across Argyll and Bute. These towns include Campbeltown, Helensburgh, Oban, Rothesay and Dunoon.

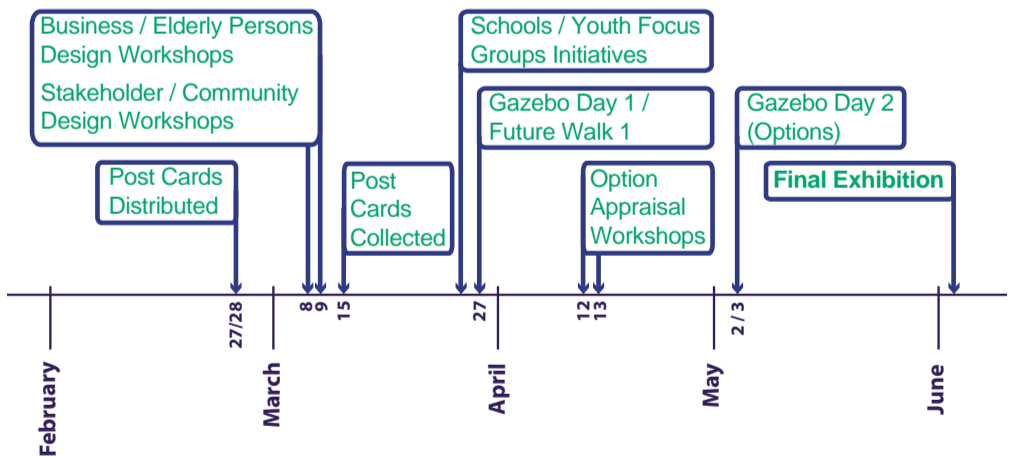
In Helensburgh, a construction budget of £5.9m will secure major improvements to the town centre and waterfront area. Specific investment will be focused on improvements to streetscape, public realm and traffic management.

Over the coming months there will be numerous opportunities for you to voice your opinion on the public realm priorities for investment **within the project boundary**. This Post Card represents the first of those opportunities. However, some of you will also receive a questionnaire from Ekos which, once completed and returned, will provide us with additional and valuable information on how you feel about Helensburgh and what you see are the key improvements needed for the town.

The final proposals for the CHORD project will be displayed at a public exhibition in June this year.
